Volunteer Help Request – Property Preparation for Indigenous Protector Movement

Dear Church Community,

My name is Zoe Meyers, and I am the Volunteer and Community Engagement Coordinator at **Our Saviour's Community Services**. I began my involvement with OSCS as a Volunteer English Teacher at the English Learning Center in the basement of **Our Saviour's Lutheran Church**. Since starting my role as Volunteer Coordinator this past April, I have absolutely loved seeing the collaboration and community building between OSCS and OSLC. I am thrilled that the Indigenous Protector Movement will soon be part of our community as well.

As many of you know, **Our Saviour's Lutheran Church** is in the process of transferring the “Green House” on Elliot Avenue to the **Indigenous Protector Movement (IPM)** as part of an ongoing commitment to reparations, healing, and relationship-building in our south Minneapolis community.

For many years, this property has been home to residents in the permanent supportive housing program at **Our Saviour's Community Services**. As those residents transition to new housing throughout July and August, we are preparing the space for its next chapter.

On October 1st this year, IPM will move into the property and begin using the space for their work that includes Indigenous-led advocacy and community safety. To support this transition, OSCS is organizing volunteer efforts throughout the summer to help get the space ready, as we aim to be welcoming and good stewards—leaving the house in excellent condition so they can immediately focus on their program and plans without needing to worry about repairs.

Volunteer Needs: We are seeking individuals and groups to assist with painting, cleaning, removing furniture

and other items left behind, light repairs, and yardwork.

Timeline: Most current residents will have moved out by July 1st. Volunteer work will take place during **July, August, and September**. Ideal hours for volunteers are **Monday - Friday between 9:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.** (this is flexible based on your availability).

How to Get Involved: If you or a group is interested in volunteering, please email or text me with your name and contact information. You can also indicate your availability and the type of work you'd like to help with. No experience is necessary—we appreciate all help! Children under 12 must always be supervised by an adult volunteer or chaperone.

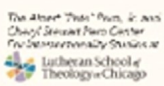

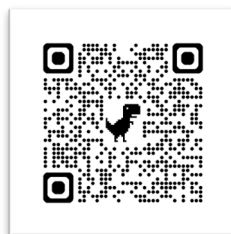

“Casa Esperanza – “Hope House” – is a ministry of the Salvadoran Lutheran Church, providing basic care to the unsheltered of San Salvador. For over 25 years this Ministry of Love & Solidarity has been a welcoming place for men, women, and families to socialize, share a hot meal, wash themselves and their clothing, receive basic first aid, and participate in substance abuse recovery.

Our Saviour’s Lutheran Church (OSLC) has long served the unhoused via Our Saviour’s Housing. Hope House’s current search for stable funding gives the OSLC community the opportunity to extend similar care to some of the most vulnerable on the streets of El Salvador’s capital.

This coming August a delegation which includes OSLC people will visit Hope House. We’ll be invited to share lunch with persons who are sleeping outside some of whom have been deported back to El Salvador by the countries where they had been residing. FOR SUCH A TIME AS THIS: Powerful Public Discipleship

What if faith wasn't meant to stay private? We are living in a time when faith is often talked about, but not lived in ways that reflect the heart of Jesus. Too often, Christianity is used to divide, exclude, or harm. But the way of Jesus is rooted in love, justice, mercy and community.

People are searching for more ways to live out our faith in a world that feels heavy, divided, and uncertain. Some of us feel it deeply right now, an urgency that this moment is asking something of us as Christians. What does it mean to truly follow Jesus... today?

The ISALAH core team at OSLC is planning a summer discipleship series, beginning with three Sundays following worship on **July 26, August 2 and August 9**. Lunch and childcare will be provided. Mark the dates on your calendars! Two more sessions will be scheduled later. We want EVERYONE to consider joining in this journey. Our OSLC Team members will be reaching out to invite folks to join us!

Our emphases will include:

Session 1: **The Power of Public Christian Witness for Such a Time as This**. We will explore the Jesus' public ministry, the importance of discipleship in Christian witness today, and over history in America, including stories of Dr. King, Bonhoeffer, and Fannie Lou Hamer.

Session 2: **The Discipline and Practice of Discipleship**. We will dig into the Christian practice of discipleship. We will explore ways to concretely love God and love our neighbor as ourselves.

Session 3: **Taking Bold Prophetic Christian Action**. We will plan and implement an action with others, grounded in our Christian faith, that is powerful, has stakes and meaning for the world around us.

Session 4: **Bearing Witness and Taking Action**. This session the actual action being taken by our group. Time and details TBD.

Session 5: **Debrief, Celebration and Preparation**. Time and details TBD.

This journey is about reclaiming the way of Jesus —together.

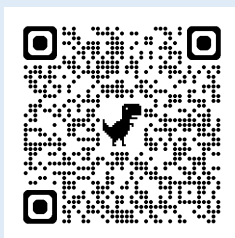
